A BETTER WAY ~ MARCH NEEDS

Bed pillows (Walmart has prices as low as \$5), pillow cases, hair brushes, body lotion and disposable razors. A Better Way's main location has been at or above capacity since last summer (26 to 31 individuals). Half of this number are children. At the current time there are 12 families in transitional apartments. A Better Way has also been working on finding housing for families that were displaced when the Muncie Inn closed recently.
