Yesterday was **Juneteenth National Independence Day**, commemorating the ending of slavery in Texas in 1865...two and a half years after the Emancipation Proclamation went into effect. And here is the **Collect** that we prayed at yesterday's Eucharist.

Almighty God, thou hast rescued thy people from slavery in Egypt, and throughout the ages thou hast never failed to hear the cries of the captives; We remember before thee our sisters and brothers in Galveston, Texas who on this day received the glad tidings of their emancipation; Forgive us for the many grave sins that delayed that liberating word; Anoint us with thy Spirit to bring good news to the poor, to proclaim release to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, and to proclaim the year of your favor; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who liveth and reigneth with thee, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.

It explores the rise of the KKK in Indiana through the lens of an event of resistance in South Bend in 1924. The exhibit goes through August 2, 2025. The **81**st **General Convention of the Episcopal Church** will take place June 23 – 28, in Louisville, Kentucky. The General Convention is the governing body of The Episcopal Church. Every three years it meets as a bicameral legislature that includes the House of Deputies (lay people and clergy from each diocese) and the House of Bishops.

There will be many activities surrounding Convention, including Bishop Michael Curry's **final revival** as Presiding Bishop. On Wednesday morning, a new Presiding Bishop will be elected for a nine-year term. The House of Bishops does the electing during a sequestered session in the context of prayer and reflection.
