The **81**st General Convention of the Episcopal Church is currently meeting in Louisville, Kentucky. The big news of yesterday was the election of the **28**th **Presiding Bishop and Primate of the Episcopal Church. The Rt. Rev. Sean Rowe**, currently the bishop of the Episcopal Dioceses of Northwestern Pennsylvania and Western New York. He was elected by the House of Bishops from among five nominees on the first ballot. Shortly thereafter, his election was confirmed by the House of Deputies. Succeeding Bishop Michael Curry, Bishop Rowe's nine-year term will begin on November 1. More information on the transition and consecration will follow.
