A Grace Note from the Rector March 28, 2024

Dear Ones,

This evening, we begin the celebration of the most intense days of the church year. The period from sunset on Thursday to sunset on Sunday comprises the Three Great Days (sometimes known by the Latin phrase *Triduum Sanctam*). We step into a time that is unlike the time of our day-to-day life. In a very real sense, the Triduum has a single liturgy. There are many parts, but they are all connected. Some people struggle with the potential confusion between remembering and reenacting events. We do not simply reenact the foot washing or the Lord's Supper on Thursday night, and we do not crucify Christ anew on Good Friday. Instead, we gather to remember what God has done for us in Christ. Here is one of the Collects that we prayed on Palm Sunday.

Assist us mercifully with your help, O Lord God of our salvation, that we may enter with joy upon the contemplation of those mighty acts, whereby you have given us life and immortality; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

I encourage you to give yourself the gift of immersing yourself in the liturgical life of these days. While you're giving yourself that gift, think about inviting someone you know to share this holy time with us.
