Dear Ones,

November 11th is **Veterans' Day**, the day set aside to remember those who are serving or have served our country who are living. On Veterans' Day, as a community, we express our gratitude for their service to our nation. Here's a prayer of thanksgiving for heroic service (BCP, 839).

O Judge of the nations, we remember before you with grateful hearts the men and women of our country who in the day of decision ventured much for the liberties we now enjoy. This week's Stewardship Moment is from Lis Mitchell.

On a blustery day in 1974, we bundled our three daughters up and decided to investigate the downtown Episcopal church. My mother-in-law, a Pentecostal minister, suggested in a nice way that perhaps the children would benefit by going to Sunday school. We were greeted warmly and decided to return the following Sunday. We soon became involved in all the activities offered, choir, altar guild, vestry, St. Mary's, and Sunday Suppers. It was rewarding later to be part of the building committee, the stewardship drive and designing the church directories. Our daughters were baptized and confirmed at Grace, and one was married here. In the early seventies change was coming to the Episcopal Church. A revised prayer book and a new hymnal were subjects of controversy, later, the ordination of women became more common. Over the past fifty years we made many good friends and welcomed three new rectors, and two interim priests.

Time has changed our parish, but the heart of Grace Church remains. It is a place of peace, learning, holiness, and community. I am so glad we decided to investigate that Episcopal church on the corner!
