O God, our times are in your hand: Look with favor, we pray, on your servants as they begin another year. Grant that they may grow in wisdom and grace, and strengthen their trust in your goodness all the days of their lives; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Finally, **speaking of angels**... Several people have asked me about the icon that was presented to new members last Sunday. The **Rublev Trinity** is honored as one of the greatest icon treasures of the world, showing forth the Holy Trinity revealed to Abraham and Sara in the form of **three angels** (Genesis 18).

For me, it is the great icon of hospitality. You will notice one just above the credence table to the left of the altar. Andre Rublev painted this masterpiece in the early 15th century for the iconostasis of the Holy Trinity Cathedral at the Trinity Lavra St. Sergius Monastery in Sergei Posad, Russia. Rublev inherited an iconography that included Abraham and Sarah, but he chose to remove them to emphasize the transcendent revelation to humanity of the ever-present Triune Godhead.

The principal interpretation of this icon is that the central angel represents God the Son, who with the angel on the right representing God the Holy Spirit, turn their inclined heads towards the angel on the left representing God the Father. Luminous robes, majestic faces, and bright but subtle colors serve to draw the viewer's attention into and beyond the figures themselves to contemplate heaven. Blessed be the Holy and Undivided Trinity. Amen.
